European Elections

The citizens of the European Union have decided.

About 43% of European citizens voted in this year's European Elections at the beginning of June.

736 Members of the European Parliament (MEPs) have been elected for a five-year term. They will form the new European Parliament, meeting for the first time on 14 July in Strasbourg. They will form transnational political groups and then elect a President as well as 14 Vice-Presidents who will serve for two and a half years.
