### Q How can I find a job in another EU country?

- A: - Visit the EURES job mobility Web portal (<http://ec.europa.eu/eures/home.jsp?lang=en>)
- Contact your local Jobcentre and ask about EU vacancies
  - Check the vacancy advertisements in the newspapers of your “host” country (e.g. in a public library).
  - Contact the host country Public Employment Service. Ask to speak to a EURES adviser who is experienced in helping foreign citizens.
